

North St Marys Suburb






North St Marys is a well-established suburb that retains strong community ties. The area and its residents are poised to benefit from the nearby addition of the St Mary's metro station linking the area with the Western Sydney Airport.

Many of our First Nations population call North St Marys home, with the highest proportion of First Nations residents living here.

North St Marys has residents that require additional support to live well, with a high proportion of low-income households and high unemployment rates.

Almost half of the community rent their homes, both private and social housing. There are high levels of both rental and mortgage stress.






We are growing



Health






How we live

Housing

Nearly all residents of North St Marys live in separate houses. There is a limited number of medium density housing and no high density housing.







Housing

In North St Marys almost 50% of people rent, compared to 32% across the Penrith City LGA. A significantly higher proportion of residents rent social housing (15%) compared to the overall Penrith Population (4%).







North St Marys

In North St Marys more people than ever have completed Year 12 or have a university qualification. However, the proportion of people who have completed Year 12 or have a university qualification is significantly lower than that of the wider Penrith City LGA.

The median household income is \$1,269, lower than that of the wider Penrith City LGA, \$1,866.


