## We are culturally diverse.



Approximately one third (**32%**) of our population was born overseas. This number has grown by **4%** since 2016.




**4.5%** of our population are Aboriginal and/ or Torres Strait Islander.



**30%** speak a language other than English at home, compared to **20%** of Penrith's wider population.

## 23%

of people in Kingswood had a Bachelor or Higher degree qualification in 2021, higher than the Penrith City LGA, at **17%**.



## **52%**

of people in Kingswood aged over 15 years had completed Year 12 schooling (or equivalent) as of 2021. Since 2016, this has increased by **6%**.
