We recognise that there are barriers to living well for low-income households.

Understanding Penrith City LGA's low-income households is important to understand the needs of our whole community. Low-income households' demographic characteristics and living arrangements can differ significantly from the wider population.

For the purposes of this report, low-income households sit in the lowest quintile, the bottom 20% of equivalised incomes, using Australia as the total population. The low-income range includes households under \$500 per week.


It is important to know what these households look like so we can provide the best possible support. This cohort is often the focus of local, state and federal government strategies and policies aimed at providing support to those with limited means.








People in Penrith City LGA's low-income households are most likely to be:





Household tenure




Low-income household residents Denrith City LGA

Many people have mortgage and rental payments that exceed 30% of their income, an indicator of housing stress.



Education




Residents who live in low-income households tend to experience lower levels of education compared to the total population.



Since 2016, the proportion of low-income households with a Bachelor degree or higher increased by 1.5%.





Employment



During the COVID-19 pandemic, the proportion of those who were employed but away from work increased significantly.




Top 3 industries of employment for residents in low-income households
