

St Marys Suburb






St Marys is a dynamic and diverse suburb within the thriving City of Penrith.



In St Marys change is on the horizon, community connections are strong, cultural richness abounds and a vibrant future awaits.










There are over 12,000 people in Penrith LGA who need help in their day to day lives due to disability. A significant proportion of the community live with at least one long-term health condition.

Residents with at least one long-term health condition










In St Marys, less households were purchasing or fully-owned their homes, compared to Penrith LGA and a larger proportion were renting in both social and private housing.






Housing stress

Many people have mortgage and rental payments that exceed 30% of their income, an indicator of housing stress.






