

#### Kingswood Suburb






Kingswood is growing and transforming, capitalising on its proximity to key health precincts, educational institutions and transport infrastructure.



Kingswood has a number of residents who require additional support to live well, with a number of people who rent social housing.






## We are growing

Top three countries of birth in Kingswood:






# Housing








## Housing


