First Nations Residents

An important part of our broader community, our First Nations peoples have many unique strengths and challenges. When compared with the wider Penrith City LGA our First Nations communities:

- Have perceptions of quality of life that are on par with wider Penrith City LGA
 ranking excellent, very good or good.
- Are more satisfied with quality of life measures – e.g personal relationships, standard of living, mental health, current achievements in life, physical health, future security and feeling a part of the community.
- Are more likely to walk around the neighbourhood using streets, footpaths, parks, ovals or bushlands.

- Are less likely to be able to raise \$2,000 if needed in an emergency.
- Were more likely to have experienced one episode of food shortage in the last 12 months.
- Are more likely to experience barriers to accessing services due to discrimination.

Since **2016**, the number of First Nations peoples has increased by **1.1%**, making up **5%** of Penrith's population.







First Nations Status




The majority of Penrith City LGA's First Nations Peoples are Aboriginal

- **97%** (10,578 people) Aboriginal
- 1.7% (184 people) Torres Strait Islander
- 1.5% (166 people) both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders

First Nations Language


First Nations People in Penrith

Age

Penrith City LGA's First Nations population is significantly younger than the non-indigenous population.

The median age for First Nations people in Penrith LGA is 22, while the median age of the broader LGA is 35.

67% of our First Nations population live with their family, this is higher than the Penrith City LGA.



Education

Fewer First Nations students aged 15 years or older are completing Year 12

14.4% since 2016


Rates of completion by First Nations students in Years 8-11 suggest they are leaving school earlier.



Education

Fewer of our First Nations people are gaining Bachelor degrees or Advanced Diplomas/Diplomas, when compared to Penrith City LGA's general population.

However, a higher proportion are gaining Certificatelevel or secondary school qualifications when compared to Penrith City LGA's general population aged 15+



Employment

Participation in the labour force is similar to the overall population, but our First Nations communities have a higher unemployment rate.


